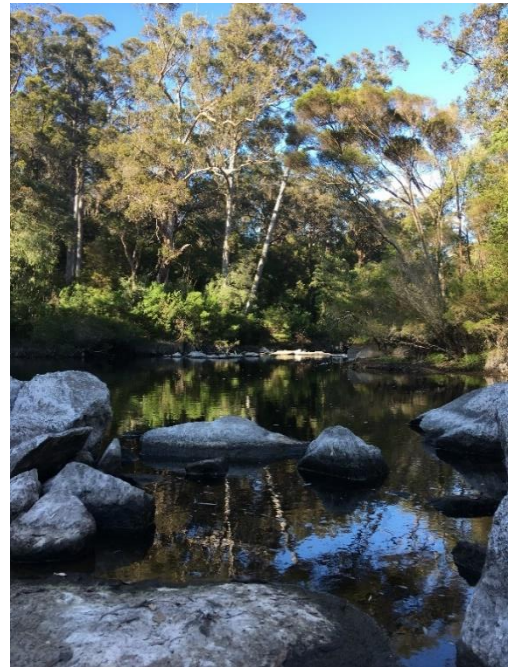




COAST TO TREES TO BEACH 4 DAY TREK

Sat 09 November 2019

It is the variety of terrain that makes this section of the Bibbulmun Track the favourite of many trekkers. Over the four days you will walk from the still waters of the Walpole Inlet, up to the Giant Tingle trees, to the reflections in the Frankland River, across to the Giant Trees and then back to the wild Southern coast.



Day one: Walpole to Frankland River Campsite 17.5km

From the stillness of the morning at Walpole Jetty we climb up to Hilltop lookout for lovely views over the Walpole Inlet to the Southern Ocean (see above). A short walk further leads to the Giant Tingle Trees. The Frankland River Hut is perched right on the bank of this largely unspoilt river. Very refreshing for a swim.

Day two: Frankland to Giants Hut 13.7km

Sunrise on the banks of the river are a delight so we linger awhile soaking up the rare experience of camping so close to a major river. The track is very pretty as it winds south parallel to the river and re-enters the beautiful karri, tingle and sheoak forest until you reach the Treetop Walk. The information at the center plus the nearby Ancient Empire free walk are well worth taking your time to linger here awhile before continuing on to Giants Campsite. Giants is quite lovely as you are surrounded by the forest on all sides of you.



Day three: Giants to Rame Head campsite 15.6km. Today, we move from the tall damp forests of the Valley of the Giants to the rugged coast between Peaceful Bay and Conspicuous Cliff. As you descend there is a lovely view over the southern ocean as you make your way down through the heathland to the coast at Conspicuous Cliff. We linger here awhile before moving onto our destination Rame Head with fabulous views up the coast.

Day four: Rame Head to Peaceful Bay 10.5km
Sometimes sunrise can be clouded over so it pays to wait a while for it to clear to enjoy those early morning views over the coast. This is a short but spectacular section and has some of the best rugged coastal scenery of WA. So, we take our time making our way to our destination through a series of sandy beaches and rocky headlands with lovely views. On the last beach it's a treat to remove the trek boots and walk the beach in the shallow water until you arrive at the quiet turquoise waters of Peaceful Bay for a delightful swim. We make our way up to the caravan park café for lunch, their fresh fish and chips highly recommended.



Cost: \$380 per person (plus transport from Peaceful Bay to Walpole shared cost, BYO food for 4 days, trekking gear available for hire) Further details will be forwarded on booking.
